

## ACADEMIC FOCUS (WATS & JWM)

WATS & JWM International Seminary aims to nurture spiritual leaders who will evangelize one's own peoples through the ministry of making disciples. Therefore, all courses must correctly and practically convey the biblical and evangelical and reformatory faith and theology through continuous and repetitive education and training. The JWA & WATTS international Seminary offers same degree in the Classroom Lesson and the Distance Learning Program.

### Grading System

Academic credit at WATS & JWA international Seminary is measured in units of credit. Units of credit are assigned to courses on the basis of national standard student work load, the Carnegie unit, which is 30 hours/ unit of credit at WATS & JWA Seminary's grading system is as follows:

## Bachelor Degree Program (B.Th, B.Cc, B.Ed)

### Requirement for Admission

1. A completed application
2. High school diploma of three years (9-12 grades) with transcripts of academic work
3. Recommendations from two responsible persons certifying the applicant's character

### Transfer of Credit

Courses credits with a minimum grade of credits earned at other accredited institution are accepted at full value to the extent that the courses are comparable to the WATS & JWA international Seminary's stated requirements. A maximum of 90 credit hours may be transferred toward the bachelor degree. An official transcript from the institution attended showing satisfactory course completion is required. Questions regarding the transfer of credits should be directed to the registrar's office.

### Requirements for Graduation

1. The bachelor degree program is designed to be completed with four academic years, although a minimum three years - a maximum six years may be granted in special cases.
2. To earn the degree the applicant is required to complete the specified number of 120 credit hours
3. The student must have experience in special field of ministry and mission.

## Master of Divinity Degree Program (M.div)

Master of Divinity (M. Div) degree is the basically professional and theological degree to be a pastor after college graduation. M. Div degree is designed for students who anticipate serving as ordained pastors, evangelists, missionaries, or in other areas of vocational Christian ministry. M. Div degree indicates the courses which are normally required at least 90 credit hours in the approved program of study for three years. This degree also serves as the basics for doctoral study for men and women preparing to do research or teach in biblical or theological disciplines.

# Doctoral Degree Program

The above doctoral degrees are the highest professional degree for those engaged in local church ministries, social service, foreign missions, and similar ministries.

## Requirement for Admission

1. All doctoral program applicants must have completed a Master of Divinity degree or an equivalent course.
2. Applicants for Doctor of Theology must have completed the Master of Divinity course and received a Master of Theology degree.
2. Doctor of Ministry and Doctor of Theology courses require at least 3 years of pastoral experience after obtaining a master's degree in ministry.
4. Must submit a recommendation from a pastor or professor.

## Transfer of Credits

A student transferring to WATS & JWM International Saminary from another institution of higher education must complete a minimum of 30 credit hours toward their doctoral degree through our International Saminary.

## Requirements for Graduation

1. The doctoral program is designed to be completed within three academic years, although a maximum of six years may be granted in special cases.
2. A dissertation project on an approved subject must be complete within due day.
